Dear Menahem,

In my letter of 10 October 1967 commenting on the views of the New Orleans District Attorney on your editorial "Garrison and Warren: Anything in Common?" I gave the names of six persons who had told me that William Gurvich was the chief investigator for the New Orleans probe. I gave those names on the basis of recollection, since I had no written records on this point, in good faith.

However, it has come to my attention that I may have been mistaken in listing Tom Bethell and Harold Weisberg as persons who informed me that Gurvich was the chief investigator. Since my recollection is disputed, and may indeed be incorrect, I readily withdraw the attribution made to both Tom Bethell and Harold Weisberg, and sincerely regret any inaccuracy on this score.

At the same time, I maintain my assertion that many visitors to New Orleans told me on their return that William Gurvich was the chief investigator and that in the case of Bill Turner you were present personally when he made this statement.
