One Dead In Territorial War

Police Hunt Gang Members

MARSHALLTON, Del. (AP)— State police said Sunday war-rants were out for the arrest of five members on "The Pagans" motorcycle gang in connection with "a territorial war" which left one man dead and four hospitalized with gunshot gunshot wounds.

Police said Boyd D. Lewis, 39, of Newark, Del., identified as president of a local "Pagans" chapter, was killed Saturday night in the "three-to-four-min-ute" gunbattle here.

An autopsy disclosed Lewis was hit 11 times with three different kinds of ammunition, detectives said.

A member of a rival gang, "The Drifters" of the Chester, Pa., area, identified as Gary Donwell, 27, of Bear, Del., was held Sunday in lieu of \$6,500 bond on first-degree murder charges, police said.

A detective sergeant said the "Pagans," in what was "evidentially an isolated incident," raided a home in a middle-class residential area where the gun-battle was waged with rifles, shotguns and assorted handguns.
