I first became acquainted with you and your work from the Jack Mc Kinney show in Philadelphia. Your sincerity and knowledge concerning the Warren Report impressed me so much that I had to read and re-read your book. The energy, perseverance, and research which you had to endure in writing the book still astounds me. Others are astounded also. For the first time in about six months I visited a friend's home, and when I saw your book there I questioned him about it. He praised you and your book and mentioned he became familiar with you from the "Long John" show on WNBE in New York City.
