Deer Dr. Boads,

Your letter of Angust 15 fails to ensure the question, from which files did you make the copy of the autopsy authorization you sent me. I must take issue with your other sements about it. That was not supplied me in response to my request for everything on the autopsy, ever which we exchanged considerable correspondance, resulting that in the assurance I had had necess to everything not still classified. It was not supplied me with the copy of the entire JFK and JEU files I ordered. And if the copy you supplied me is from the JFK I files, it is the one paper in that file, to my recollection, that does not bear the file identiciation.

New enly did the National Archives not supply this with the JFK file copies, but if you went to see your agancy's letter in which it said there was no copy, I can supply it.

I therefore remaw my question, what is the source of the copy of the subspey sutherisation you sent me and, if it is now in the JFE files and wasn't there when this file was copied for may when was it added, by woom and on who as instructions? I bedieve this is a matter of the greatest importance and I do hope you will see to it personally that there is an unequivodal, complete answer.

You say "Copies of all papers relating to the autopsy of Precident Kannedy that were transferred to the Matienal Archives by the Secret Service have been furnished to you." This is inconsistent with what the Secret Service has told me, I think it only fair to tell you, in writing. And I must you to be aware of the imports of your statement, not the least of which is that the files of the autopsy were purged before they were transferred to the Archives. The items I requested from Admiral Burkeley's receipt must be there, else this happened.

I therefore hepe you will personally am to it that this is not a case where an inadequate search was made, that you will searce yourself and then me that the documents I have requested are not, anywhere, in your custody, under whatever file designation.

And specifically, I renew my request, not responded to efter a wary long delay, for a copy of the Secret Service copy of the subspay-pictures and K-rays memo, which was transferred to your agency. I would hope, after this very long delay, now more than half a year, that it could be by return mail.
