Dear Dr. Rhoads:

Would you please have your photographer take a picture of CE 399 for me in the following manner: Put it on a grain scale so that the weight in grains will be visible. As it is placed, I would prefer the point at which a sample was removed for analysis to be visible to the lens and recorded in the picture.

I do not know what kind of a scale may be available to you, but if I am permitted a preference, I would prefer the most compact one so that both the mark on the bullet and the reading on the scale are visible and I would like the picture to be as compact as possible, showing nothing unnecessary.

If the scale is not legible or, in the opinion of your photographer, would not be, as an alternative, I would find the statement of the weight adequate.
