If I have not disclosed the next steps in this propaganda campaign to them, it is not because I have not long been fully informed about it. I would like to think that with the passing of time I may, perhaps, have succeeded in frustrating it.

There are other things that lead me to believe there will soon be similar exploits with other elements of the evidence that have been denied me for close to four years.

On a less unpleasant subject, I am glad to note in Mac's mailing of the 7th that he has introduced the described mass-transit measure. It surely is a step toward meeting one of the urgent national needs.

I also feel the property tax, but I hope any change will not be one that places a burden on those least able to support it. If some of the more glaring inequities, like the oil-depletion allowance, were eliminated....
