Segregationist's Office Says He Will Help With Plea

MYT 3/24/6/f SAVANNAH Ga. March 21 (AP) L B. Stoner, a lawyer long associated with anti-Jew-ish and anti-Negro causes, has been retained by James Earl Ray in his effort to win a new trial in the slaying of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., Mr. Stoner's office announced today.

Edward R. Fields, director of the militantly segregation-ist National States Rights party, said Mr. Stoner would help Ray change his plea from guilty to not guilty and would ask for another trial. Mr. Stoner is a lawyer for the next and his

a lawyer for the party, and his office is located in the party's headquarters here.

Ray was sentenced to 99 years in prison after he pleaded gullty in Memphis to the slaying of Dr. King last year

year.
Mr. Fields said Mr. Stoner
was on his way to Nashville,
where Ray was lodged in the
Tennessee State Penitentiary. He said Mr. Stoner would con fer with Ray tomorrow morn

fer with kay consider the prison warden, said he did not yet know whether Mr. Stoner would be allowed to see Ray... "We'll let him see him if he can present the proper credentials," Mr. Russell said. "He'll have to show that he [Ray] actually hired him as his lawyer."

In Memphis, court officials said there was nothing on file to indicate that Mr. Stoner had been designated as attorney of

record by Ray.

Criminal Court Judge W. V.

Preston Battle Jr., who presided in the Ray case, disclosed n

Wednesday that he had been t

notified by Ray that he wanted to withdraw his guilty plea and stand trial for first-degree ϵ murder.

The judge said Ray had written him that he had fired his attorney, Percy Foreman of Houston.

Ray pleaded guilty March 10. The 99-year sentence was pre-arranged by the state and Mr. Foreman.

Ray Regretted Plea

Ray was reported to have told officers who accompanied him from Memphis to the Nashville prison that he wished he had gone on trial and had taken his chances of getting a life sen-tence rather than the electric chair.

Under fa life sentence, Ray would be eligible for parole in 13 years. The 99-year term prevents him from seeking parole

for 30 years.

Mr. Stoner would be Ray's third attorney. Arthur Hanes, a former Mayor of Birmingham, Ala., had also been dismissed.

Mr. Stoner, 44 years old, has been invelved in Ka Klux Klan and anti-Jawish activities since boyhood. At 16, he was a Klan organizer and officer in Chattanorga. Tenn and he one and organizer and officer in Chat-tanooga, Tenn., and he once ap-peared as the Kleagle, or chief Klan officer, of Tennessee.

In 1945 he formed the Stoner Anti-Jewish party and mailed

out pamphlets urging removal of the Jews In 1952 he announced the formation of the Christian Anti-Jewish party and inged deportation of Jews and iconfiscation of their property for distribution to "Christian Anti-Jewish to "Christian "

Americans."

He wrote a book entitled "The Gospel of Jesus Christ Versus the Jews."

Mr. Stoner was graduated from an Atlanta law school in 1952 after two years of study, passing a state har examination while still a student in recent years, Mr. Stoner had been active in the National States Pights party and its

States Rights party and in liti-gation involving racial con-flicts. He was the party vice (Presidential candidate in 1964.) The party supported George C. Wallace for President last (

year.
