Asked whether he would represent Ray in efforts to win a new trial, he said: "I have no present plans. I have some information on the subject but at the present time I'd rather not comment on it."

Ray pleaded guilty March 10 to last year's sniper-slaying of King in Memphis, Tenn. He was sentenced to 92 years.

Since his sentencing, there

have been reports that Ray wanted to change his plea to innocent and face a first degree murder trial.

Stoner conferred with Ray in

the prison Saturday.

Memphis court officials said Tuesday nothing had been filed in connection with the Ray case since his brief trial ended after his guilty plea.
