Dear Mrs. Needleman,

Your letter was forwarded. It reached me today.

I do not dismiss what you say out of hand. There was a known threat against JFK in Miami. I go into it in Oswald in New Orleans, which is out of print, and in Frame-Up.

The Miami motorcade was cancelled because of known threat(s).

You say you can identify the man you saw acting suspiciously. Can you please describe him with all the detail possible?

If you think the friend who was then with you would also, I'd appreciate that.

If you are handy at sketching, please make an attempt.

Try to include approximate age, height, weight, complexion, ethnic suggestions if any and in addition to what is usual, like color of hair, any identifying characteristics you may recall, such as scars, kind of clothing, etc.

It would also be good to have a record of approximately where he was in the crowd, especially oriented with JFK's position.

Was he alone? Was he looking in any special direction?

What was there about his behavior that made you suspicious?

Did you actually see the gun? If so, can you describe it?

Please do not be afraid of being considered nutty, as you put it. There really was a known threat and it was withheld from the Warren Commission. So I do not consider that if you have nothing other than suspicion it is nutty. (Some of the suppressed FBI reports are in Frame-Up, in facsimile.) There was a real but suppressed incident.

This is why I would appreciate all the details you can now remember, as well as you can remember them.
