Anyway, it was an emotional moment for me when this grandfather's second son walked in with that phone, which we did not expect, and first think last Saturday morning because I'd told Frankie I was going over to Bell as soon as I could so that Lil would not be without some security, protection. Bell is 10 minutes away.

Betsy should get at least a new car for what she did in that case! Bravo!
