The press secretary said the article Left the suggestion that Mr. Nixon or someone at the White House had intervened to obtain a low assessment. He went on:

"We have absolutely nothing to do with tax assessments . . . the tax assessors should assess. That's their job."

The Register quoted Orange County assessor Jack Vallerga, as saying the current value placed on Mr Nixon's property is \$1.37

million. Mr. Nixon peid \$1.5 million for the property in 1969 and the General Services Administration reported on June 21 spending \$703,367 for improvements, most of them attributed to security considerations.
