## **Blood Pressure Rises** rry Nixon Doctors

LONG BEACH, Calif., Nov. 12-Former President Nixon suffers from potentially dangerous sharp rises in blood pressure when he walks around his hospital room or doctors said today.

Dr. John C. Lungren, the former President's personal physician, said these episodes of high blood pressure concern the doctors taking care of Mr. Nixon.
