Blood from Babies -As a nutritional experiment, the Agriculture Department was all set to draw blood from the jugular veins of ghetto babies until we started asking questions. Now the dangerous idea has been

scrapped.

The department had planned to extract blood from infants to measure its vitamin, iron and protein content. So horrified was the Indian Health Services that it refused to let any babies under its jurisdiction be used

Although a highly skilled technician might draw blood safely from a baby's veins, there was no assurance Agriculture's project would be manned by such specialists. One bad mistake could traumatize a baby for life.

Following our inquiries, Agriculture Secretary Earl Butz's medical advisers assured us that all infant blood taken for the tests would be from heelpricks, loberpricks or fingerpricks.
