### CUT OUT CANCER

Our soldiers are going to win the battles.

They have won so far, whenever the odds have been shorter than

five or six to one against them.

There are only two things that can save the Axis from "Unconditional Surrender", or make us throw away the fruits of battle by surrendering to Nazidom on the political front.

One of these things is the new pro-appeasement 1943-style isolationism, which, backed by expert, well-paid and wholly subversive pro-

paganda, now threatens to strangle our country.

# IN FRANCE: OUR 5th COLUMN

ED. NOTE: Alfred Michel is a pseudonym for an emigre from the Love Countries, who lived in France for almost three years before excepting to the United States only a few months ago. In his native land, M. Michel was an outstanding journalist whose contributions to the anti-Nazi movement, beginning in 1933 and continuing to the present, are well known to and appreciated by the Anti-Nazi League. For obvious reasons, we cannot disclose his identity at this time.

### THE UNDERGROUND IS STRONG

People in the United States are all too ready to see in the French underground movement a kind of political party situation, and to regard it as something to be "for" or "against" as one is for the Democrats or the Republicans -- or in recent days, possibly, for DeGaulle

In reality, that which is generally called the underground movement has only two sides—neither of them political in a "party" sense— First: The underground is the expression of the French people's

hatred of the German occupation and of the German robbery and dishonoring of France. I am sure that almost every Frenchman has that

Second: The underground is a well organized movement which is recruited from all groups and from all professions. A very important part of this movement is the small bourgeoisie element, which, before 1940, were organized in the Radical Socialist Party (Herriot's party conservative, despite its name), the right wing of the Socialist Party (S.F.I.O.), the demobilized service men and—perhaps most important of all, on account of their influence on the masses and on the young peo-ple—the teachers and many of the Roman Catholic clergy (particularly priests of the smaller parishes).

### ABLE LEADERS

Until the end of August, 1942, the underground or "people's" move ment—referred to generally as the DeGaulle movement—did not work together with the Communist underground. I cannot tell whether there was perhaps collaboration between the leaders of the two movements,

but I know that the basic groups were working separately at this time.

The basic ideologies of the DeGaulle underground movement were
the principles of the French Revolution and the Third Republic; liberte,
fraternite, egalite. But the tendency was toward the conservative, for a great part of the members were small proprietors or people who wished to become proprietors. The militant groups of the movement consisted of young men and war veterans.

I had the impression that the leaders of the DeGaulle movement

both in occupied and unoccupied France were really able men. As proof: their men were very seldom caught though they were very active in

sabotage, propaganda and demonstrations.

The radio broadcasts from London, in French, helped a lot to create the atmosphere of resistance in France. Almost all the French people listened to these broadcasts, for the information of the newspapers could be only one-sided, as the entire press was controlled and censored by Vichy authorities, and all information was monopolized by the O.F.L. In the beginning, the Swiss-French newspapers were much read, but later on they were only allowed to be imported or printed in specially "purified" editions. Consequently there were only the English broadcasts left to inform the French population about world events as well as about things going on inside France itself.

### UNITY FIRST ESSENTIAL

I could not observe the reaction of the French to the North African events, but I am sure that the existence of two French fighting centers events, but I am sure that the existence of two French alguing centers outside of France could have only one result, and that is to split the feelings of the population and those of the organized militant movement. I know that at the time Giraud escaped from the German prison camp, he was very popular among the French masses and the DeGaul-

It is beyond any doubt that the mighty underground movements of the occupied European countries are of the utmost importance to the war effort of the United Nations. Therefore, it is our duty to see to it that everything is done that could possibly strengthen those move one that everything is done that could possibly strengthan chose move-ments and to prevent anything from being done that would split their unified forces and so weaken them. To split them would mean playing

into the hands of our enemies.

### THE UNDERGROUND RAILWAY

Many facts prove how well the underground is working. One of the most interesting is the underground railway, an organization which brings military or politically important persons out of the occupied countries. I once observed its workings in a train on the Paris-Bor-deaux line. Opposite us was sitting a very young French girl (17 years old, as I later learned), and with her a young man. The young man did not speak a word during the trip and so I got the impression that he probably was mute. But some time later I met this same girl in a Southern French town and one of our men told me that this young girl was bringing three or four British aviators out of occupied France

Another case which we can safely relate now, concerns the way people got from Marseilles to Gibraltar. In order to improve the food situation the Vichy government decided to send a fleet of fishing boats out to the Moroccan coast of the Atlantic Ocean, because fishing was so much better there than in the Mediterranean. In the beginning, many of the boats' crews left the ships as soon as they came to the Straits of Gibraltar, and these men were taken over to the United Nations side by the British Navy. To prevent this, the Vichy government sent along some small destroyers to escort the fishing boats, and ordered the gunners to shoot at anyone who tried to "desert". But the British Navy, communicating by loudspeaker with the Frenchmen, told them to jump in the water, and that they would come to their rescue then. The French gunners shot as they were ordered to, but their firing must have been for the record only, because they never hit a single one of the "deserters!" In this way, I saw many of my acquaintances disappear from France, and they are no doubt fighting bravely on our side,

Another interesting case: A Frenchman who had served as an officer in the French Colonial Army, under Vichy, had quit because he could not stand the fascist atmosphere prevailing at that time. One day he came to say goodbye and told me that he was leaving the South of France for a job in Nantes, a town in occupied France. Naturally, I was astonished at this act because surely the atmosphere in occupied I was astonished at this act because surely the atmosphere in occupied France would not be more to his liking. I could not make it out in the beginning. But a couple of days later I heard that the British had tried to disembark a "Gommando" force at St. Nazare, which is only a few miles distance from Nantes. A miraculous coincidencel—and apparently my friend had performed well the duties of his new "job", to aid in this landing raid.

### FRENCH PEOPLE WITH US

The following incident will prove how scriously these brave people were taking their task. At this time, specialists in aviation and plane construction were the most urgently needed by the United Nations. I introduced one of my French friends who was eager to serve with the United Nations to a man of the underground, but the latter could not take up his case and told him that he had even refused to send out his own son who was in grave danger there. He said that only the badly-needed aviation specialists were worth the risk of sending out of the country just then.

It is well-known how much effort the Germans put into creating their fifth-columns all over the world-and here, in France, WE possess a mighty fifth-column on our side, toward the creation of which we did not have to play any important part. We may well say that the French people presented it to us on a silver platter. Would it not be foolish for us not to make the fullest use of this valuable gift?

Adolph Cremieux as Minister of Justice decreed, "The native Jews of the departments of native Jews of the departments of Algeria are declared French citizens. Therefore, dating from the promulgation of the present decree, their real status and personal status will be governed by French law; all rights acquired up to this day remain inviolable."

Because General Giraud bases the abrogation of the Decree on a special plea of removal of racial discrimination, it is well to examine on what foundation this special pleading rests. The Arab can, upon request, be admitted to French citizenship, but in this event he must be governed by the civil and political laws of France. It has been so since 1865 and yet the records show that only an average of thirty Moslems per year have been naturalized since then.

If General Giraud instead of abolishing the Cremieux Decree had extended French citizenship to all natives prepared to accept French civil law and to renounce personal status, he would have created un-bounded benefits to all in Algeria. There is, for example, the story of Jacob and Esau—a tale of a conniving young man who clothed himself in the skin of wild animals to deceive his blind of wild animals to deceive his blind of wild animals to deceive his blind father. Today the Nazi propagand-ists in America have clothed themselves in a garment which they fervently hope the American peo-ple will mistake for some of the ple will mistake for some or the elements of liberty—at least long enough to be misled and trapped. The new Nazi propaganda line is: "Don't be taken in by price regula-tion; Don't be persuaded to volun-teer for air raid warden duty; Don't take part in civilian defense Don't take part in civilian detense committees, for these are just political devices meant to control your vote or to impose some thought-pattern on you. By this kind of clever but diabolical device, native Nazis and their richly-subsidized customer's men-even including, I regret to say, some per-sons holding positions of high public trust with vast political power—seek to confuse the American people by spreading suspicio and distrust of their governmen and of the essential machinery of democracy as it is represented in the Logislative and Executive De-partments."





The National Catholic Welfare Conference has issued an excellent pamphlet of 144 pages, bound in a good ecclesiastical format, entitled "The Nazi War Against the Catholic Church." This is one of the best statements of the case against Nazism that we have seen.

The leading article in a recent issue of Gerald L. K. Smith's THE CROSS AND THE FLAG was one by Louis Bromfield entitled "FAMINE? Will Bureaucratic Stupidity Bring Hunger to America?"

We were a little doubtful about the fact that any one of Mr. Bromfield's convictions would contribute to a sheet like THE CROSS AND THE FLAG so we wrote to Mr. Bromfield and asked him how his article got there. He replied:

Our Hitler-helping propagandists have taken to pornography. Not that we're surprised because the Nazis are well known for their lasciviousness. But here's how it is being worked in the U.S. A. Certainly, at one time or another, you've seen one of of the anti-Semitic doggerels floating about — The Marine Song, Onward Christian Soldiers, The First American to Down a Jap Plane, ad nauseum. People have grown tired of these and when they see one, throw it away as old stuff. So now, the great spiritual uplifters who are printing these things, have a new way of attracting readers' at-tention. At the top of the printed page appears as filthy and lewd a poem as has ever been printed — four or five verses of sewerage. Convinced this is something new, the reader reads on. The punch, of course, is the Jew-baiting lines which appear at the bottom of the page. We always suspected that only morons fell for anti-semitism anyway.

We've located four of the printers from whom this stuff comes. They are big fellows too. How-ever, the owners of these shops feign ignorance as to what's going on. They say they can't keep tabs on their employees' pranks. Seems that when the compositors and the linotypers have nothing else to do, they run these things off, "just for fun," of

We don't think it's so funny and have voiced that opinion in stentorian tones. Some of the pranksters have been fired for their acts by the union. But they'll find other jobs and we'll have to go to work finding them all over again

NAZI PROPAGANDA IS GLOBAL. These documents show how the Nazi "World-Service," a propaganda news release issued fortnightly from Erfurt, Germany, tried to manufacture a world-wide anti-Semitic "smear" campaign acquiret Persident Franklip D. Rossayalt

paign against President Franklin D. Roosevelt.

"World-Service," publication of the Weltdienst, official Nazi agency for the breeding of Fifth Columns in the democracies, was edited by Ulrich Fleischhauer, who was indicted for sedition by a Federal Grand Jury last July because of his far-reaching connections with many of the other defendants named in the sedition conspiracy indictments. "World-Service" was printed bi-monthly in eight different languages — English, German, Danish, Spanish, Hungarian, Polish, French and Russian. — and was sent to the editors of newspapers all over the world, wherever the Nazis thought they could plant their virus.

These illustrations show how the German propagandist Fleischhauer and one of his American collaborators, Edmondson, planned and carried out an international propaganda plot against the President of the United States. All this was done when the United States was still legally at peace with Germany.

The Anti-Nazi League charges that the same kind of notives and the same kind of a plot are behind much of the propaganda now being spread over the United States, making use of anti-Semitic material to "smear".our Commander-in-Chief and the heads of government agencies established to administer civilian defense plans, war rationing regulations necessary if we are to keep our soldiers supplied with arms and food, and all the other economic and industrial regulations necessary to let soldiers on the home front do their part in winning the war. This same kind of "smear" has lately flared up in alarmist and disgusting speeches by leading appeasers and 1943-style isolationists, and even on the floor of Convress.

Here are the facts about the damning documents shown above:

At (1) is the cover page of Fleischhauer's "World-Ser-

vice," issue published at Erfurt, Germany, November 15, 1938. The "Contents" features an article "Roosevelt Rules America." Page 4 of this Nazi release illustrated at (2) above contains a carefully doctored "genealogical" chart entitled, "Famous Sons of Famous Fathers — The Roosevelts." This chart has well-known old Dutch and Flemish names underlined so as to make them appear to be Jewish and is accompanied by quotations from a number of notorious "Americans" like Deatherage, Winrod, Ham Fish and Edmondson. See (3), above. Fleischhauer's conclusion from his fake "genealogical" researches is that this alleged Roosevelt ancestry "explains... his strong aversion to the authoritarian states (i.e., Germany and Japan)" and also "explains the strong tendency toward Communism, observable in the American form of government!"

The man who apparently gets credit for planning this particularly blatant piece of enemy propaganda is one Robert Edmondson, now under indictment (for sedition) by a Federal Grand Jury, one of whose publications reproducing the same "chart" is illustrated above at (4). This particular Edmondson publication, incidentally, presents the "chart" as a reprint of an illustration which appeared in a small Arizona newspaper and shows that the same material was being used simultaneously by Gerald Winrod, Kansas editor now also under indictment.

The high esteem in which Edmondson was held by his Erfurt associates is shown by the testimonial letter which his collaborators, attending a Nazi Pan-Aryan Conference, sent him. This is shown in (5).

The most startling aspect of all this was that the German anti-Roosevelt "smear campaign" was not confined to American or even English editors — on the contrary, it got its particular attention in "nationalist" and other pro-totalitarian organs in the various European countries whom Germany was shortly to attack.

See above, for example, at (6), the front page of VOLKSVERWERING, nationalist newspaper printed in Antwerp, Belgium, January 29, 1939, which devotes its en-

Also shown above at (7) is ps of the front page of LA LIBRE PAROLE, pro-Nazi Fren language organ, printed almost simultaneously in Par which devoted its entire front page for January 30, 193 to the same material. How closely all these Nazi progranda publications in the United States, France, Hollar Germany and elsewhere, followed exactly the same ori inal, can be seen from the fact that the Roosevelt "char in everyone of the places that it appears above, seems have been photographed from a single master copy, as shown by certain small markings visible along the upp margin of every one of the cuts.

Other pages of the same issue of "World-Service" shot at (1) and (2) contain advertisements of "The Protocols the Elders of Zion" and of Weltdienst publications issue by Good and other propagandists. See documents (8) at (9) above. A special section of the French LA LIBF PAROLE was directed toward building Nazi strength North Africa. See (10) above.
