On 12/6/63, [redacted] /Dallas, Texas, advised that on 11/28/63, she and her sister, [redacted] were visiting in Terarkana, Texas. Sometime between 22:50 and 5:30 PM, on 11/28/63, they were driving around, and drove to the [redacted] Johnson Motel and turned around, then started driving west on Highway 67, toward Dallas. They stopped at Pecan Joe's, and went in to get something to eat. An employee at Pecan Joe's, the only one on duty, was a white female about 60 years old, 5' 2", 130 lbs., gray hair combed up with short curls on top, and this woman started a conversation with them by mentioning that their auto license indicated they were from Dallas. They talked about the death of President KENNEDY, and [redacted] mentioned that it was her belief that this was God's plan, just as everything that happens is God's plan. This employee then mentioned that several days previously, which was after the death of President KENNEDY, some "Government man" was in there and mentioned that something was going to come out in a month or two that would show that President KENNEDY had been trying to work something out with a foreign country that would just ruin the United States. This "Government man" did not specify what this was, that he was talking about, and did not specifically say so, but he left the impression that something good would come out of the President's death, because this deal probably would not be worked out. The woman employee at Pecan Joe's did not talk like she knew this Government man. This woman did not specifically say that this Govt. man said that the assassination was a good thing. [redacted] said she thought this woman employee at Pecan Joe's was just engaged in some malicious gossip.

ACTION: File. There is no indication that persons involved in this have any information of value in this case.
