LEE HARVEY CSWALD

By letter dated August 28, 1964, the President's Commission requested additional investigation concerning the allegation of Sylvia Cdio that she observed Lee Harvey Oswald in the company of two Cuban or Mexican men sometime in late September or early Cctober, 1963.

Odio, in her testimony before the President's Commission, has claimed that three individuals, two possibly Cuban underground members or Hericans, and Lee Harvey Oswald, visited her apartment in late September, 1963, to solicit her aid in the underground.

Odio is alleged to have told Hrs. C. L. Connell on November 28, 1963, that Cavald had spoken previously to small Cuban exile groups in Dallas and had been well received. Odio is also alleged by Hrs. Connell to have mentioned that a friend of Odio's had called a Cuban friend in New Orleans who warned the Cubans in Dallas to beware of Oswald, as they considered him a possible double-agent trying to infiltrate the Cuban exile groups.
