Your note on Bradley illustrates how those whose motives I have always questioned (and I have other questions about some of them) impose upon the genuine concern of people like you.

It was Edgar Eugene Bradley. There is no reason at all to believe he was in Dallas, leave alone in the Dal-Tex Bldg.

Nor is there any reason of which I am aware to believe he belongs anywhere in any responsible assassination investigation.

What we have here in addition to the limitless irresponsibility that has hurt us all is a political prejudice of those considering themselves "liberals" against those they regard as "reactionary." Bradley is an utterly repugnant person. But that does not make him guilty of anything nor does it justify suspicion by itself. Nor do his beliefs or McIntrye's.
