Dear Mr. Boll,

The anonymous memo on Oswald as a homosexual is interesting. It comes when I am snowed under and cannot respond in detail. In general, I recall only one report of Oswald as a homosexual and it did not check out. That was when he was young and lived on Exchange alley.

Garrison, however, seemed to think he was.

I heard of more than the one report you refer to on Garrison as a homosexual but I never saw anything to confirm it and he did run around with women other than his wife/

The information of Shaw is, as far as I can tell, 100% accurate. Much of it coincides with what I learned. However, my interest in New Orleans was in Oswald, not Shaw, and I never checked anything out on Shaw. I did hear much and to a large degree and in some details this memo and what I heard agree.

Shaw did have a mentor. I've forgotten his name, probably have it in some notes. I think he was big in Western Union or United Fruit.

He did have a younger man living with him. And Shaw would not let him in the building he managed. Two separate lives.

I'd not heard of the wealthy Texan who was scared.

One problem with these reports is that Oswald reflects having made very little money. he got little if he did it and did not do it often.

I just don't know. But it is interesting.

So I do look forward to the memo you say you are writing.
