Records Mexican authorities at Matamoros Nuevo Progresso, Reynosa, Camargo, San Miguel de Camargo, Tamps., Mexico, and Piedras Negras, Ciudad Acuna, Coahuila, Mexico, negative on travel of OSWALD, wife and mother. Names of certain persons who entered Mexico on or about 9/26/63, set out; OSWALD entered on 9/26/63. Motel and hotel check at Zepeda Cotulla and Laredo, Texas, negative re OSWALD. Records of Trans-Texas and Braniff Airways, San Antonio for 10/3/63, for OSWALD and wife negative. Records Autobuses Anajaua, Piedras Negras, Mexico, negative re OSWALD, wife and mother for 10/1-3/63. Two car rental agencies Laredo, Texas, negative for OSWALD on 10/3/63. J. G. HARDIN obtained ride on 10/3/63, at Richland, Texas, with person who he believed OSWALD. Manager, Austin Motel, Austin, Texas, advised BILL RANDLE, Irving, Texas, registered at motel 11/22/63, and claimed his wife worked in same building as OSWALD. Manager alleges RANDLE checked out of motel after receiving long distance telephone call that his wife had been called in for questioning regarding the assassination of President KENNEDY. C. ESPINOSA met individual who gave his name as LEE HARVEY OSWALD on 10/10/63, on street in Dallas, Texas. TEC furnished file on OSWALD reflecting data regarding unemployment insurance. OSWALD's half-brother, S/Sgt. JOHN E. PIC presently stationed Lackland Air Force Base, Texas, interviewed. PIC furnished background information re family and said only time he had any contact with OSWALD since 1953 was on Thanksgiving day, 1962. Texas DEB file contains only newspaper clippings. Investigation determined American Airlines passenger lists destroyed after

MARIO DEL VALLE, Mexican Immigration Inspector, advised there is no record of entry or exit, to or from Mexico, by LEE HARVEY OSWALD or aliases, nor is there any record of entry for his wife and mother from August 10, 1963, to September 22, 1963. The only entry of OSWALD is on September 26, 1963.

DEL VALLE furnished the following names of people with tourist card numbers preceeding and following that of OSWALD's, 824085, and other people who entered Mexico who are from New Orleans. All are fifteen day permits:

On November 26, 1953, EDWIN OSWALD, 1343 Filbert Street, San Francisco, California, contacted the San Francisco Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and advised that approximately in 1951, prior to December 15 of that year, while a student at the University of Colorado, he met HARRY NIER who was the leader of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee (FCCC) at the University of Colorado. OSWALD said that present on this occasion were the following:

ED NIER, who is now a stockbroker with offices at 733 Security Building, Denver, Colorado.

JACK FLOREN, then just out of Yale University, now residing on Grapa Street, Denver, Colorado, and employed by the Robinson Brick and Tile Company.

JOHN BOWLER, who lives on Koplak Street in Aurora, a suburb of Denver, Colorado.

OSWALD stated that ED BUCH asked HARRY NIER if he was a Communist. NIER said no, but added that he was a "Marxist." When NIER claimed Cuba and CASTRO were for peace, ED BUCH asked NIER about the terrorist group in Venezuela. NIER replied approximately as follows:

"I don't know about that, but I'm going to Mexico and I know a guy named Oswald and I'll ask him."

OSWALD related that he particularly remembered the name OSWALD. OSWALD said that he had talked by phone with his parents, who reside at 348 Gilpin, Denver, Colorado, and his father stated that HARRY NIER had been interviewed over the radio at Denver and had denied knowing OSWALD.

On November 27, 1963, Mr. HARRY OSWALD, 1333 Filbert Street, San Francisco, California, was reinterviewed and stated that the occasion, on which he met HARRY WIER at Denver, Colorado, could very well have taken place in 1962, rather than in 1961.

OSWALD said that one way, in which the date of this meeting might be fixed, would be by checking the travel of HARRY WIER who stated on that occasion that he was going to Mexico in a week or two.

OSWALD related that he is certain of the name OSWALD, because he recalls that when WIER mentioned this name he immediately thought of the fact that a nurse by the name of Miss OSWALD had been employed in his home a year or so earlier to care for his sister's children, and that he almost jokingly asked WIER whether this OSWALD might be a relative of this nurse.
