Shortly after 8:00 AM, I telephoned the Bureau and talked to Supervisor DONALD HUPPERT. I advised him that during the night an unknown caller had furnished the following information to this office, "I represent a committee that is neither right wing nor left wing, and tonight, tomorrow morning, or tomorrow night, we are going to kill the man that killed the President. There will be no excitement and we will kill him. We wanted to be sure and tell the FBI, Police Department and Sheriff's Office and we will be there and we will kill him"

I advised Mr. HUPPERT that the employee taking this information had indicated that the caller seemed to be very calm while talking and seemed to possibly be reading the statement; that the caller had a mature sounding voice, and that there might have been more than one voice; that the first caller had asked for the man in charge and then apparently turned the phone over to a second man who made the above statement.

I advised Mr. HUPPERT that this information had been made available by phone to the man on duty in the Sheriff's Office, Dallas, and to a Captain on duty in the Dallas Police Department. I advised him that the Sheriff's Office had received a similar call, but that the Police Department had indicated to us that they had not been contacted by this unknown person, as far as they could find out.

Between 8:30 AM and 10:00 AM, I called the listed number of FORREST V. SORRELS, Director of Secret Service in Dallas, and I called the Dallas Police Department and asked for SORRELS on three occasions during this time and was unable to reach him.
