## EYEWITNESS IDENTIFICATION OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD

AS THE ASSASSIN OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY:

The only eyewitness to give a description of the suspect who allegedly fired the shots at the Presidential motorcade, Howard Grennan, gave thefollowing information to the police:

the man was possible (sic) 5 foot 10...

(despite this, the Commission
has concluded that the assassin
was "most probably" either sitting
or kneeling)...160 to 170 pounds."(AR, 5.144)


It was on the basis of this tescription that Officer Tippit allegedly apprehended Oswald, whom he first saw from the back, as the suspect was walking in a parallel direction, ahead of Tippit's car.

Here are the Dallas Police Department's records of uswald's height and weight, made while Oswald was in their custody during the week-end of Nov.22-24,'63.

Bear in mind that Tippit recognized a suspect whom he saw only from the back and who was between thirty and forty pounds lighter in weight than the description demanded.

The fact that Brennan gave the man's height as "possible 5 foot 10," although the Commission says the man had to be sitting or kneeling, creates another obstacle in Tippit's path. Yet, seemingly, Tippit didn't have the slightest difficulty in pinpointing his man with startling ease and speed.

height was omitted. In his testimony before the Commission, Brennan described the person he saw as "\* a man in his early thirties, fair complexion, sheader, but neat, neat skender, before 10 \* \* 160 to 170 pounds," Oswald was 5'9", slender and 24 years old. When arrested, he gave his weight as 140 pounds. On other occasions he gave weights of both 140 and 150 pounds. The New Orleans police records of his arrest in August of 1904 show a weight of 170 pounds. The gauge that 150 pounds.
