### Rep. Ford Urges Faster Work By Committee in King Probe

Rep. Harold Ford, D-Memphis, said today he has asked for "stepped up work" by the House Select Committee on Assassinations in its investigations of the deaths of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and President John F. Kennedy. Ford said he hopes the committee can release its findings to the public within the next 60 days. "I believe the committee owes the people of this nation some answers, and those answers need to come very soon," Ford said. Ford's appeal will go to the committee chairman, Louis Stokes. The committee was first established in the second session of the 94th Congress and reconstituted last year for the duration of the 95th Congress.

### Manuscript Oswald Wrote To Be Published This Year

DALLAS (UPI) — A 200-page manuscript containing Lee Harvey Oswald's opinions on philosophy and his disenchantment with his life in Russia will be published later this year, an attorney says.

Attorney Patrick S. Russell Jr. said the manuscript, written by Oswald in the late '50s and early '60s but kept secret until three or four days ago, describes Oswald's disenchantment with Russian life.

Russell said the manuscript will be published by the family of the late George Demohrenschildt.

Demohrenschildt died of a self-inflicted shotgun wound March 29, 1977, in Florida while he was being sought by the House Assassinations Committee for testimony about his alleged prior knowledge of the John F. Kennedy assassination.

Russell said Oswald gave Demohrenschildt the manuscript to edit.

Harold, letter to me Feb 28/78:

Dear Mr. Moss:

I have your letter dated 27 February & stamp, Thank's.

About the suit with the FBI & UPI as defendants, it was mailed to the U.S. District Court, Knoxville, about a week ago. The prison counselor tells me Judge Robert Taylor is still "considering" whether to let me file it in forma pauperis. (George McMillian is also a defendant).

I don't expect to win any of these suits, rather have the defendants make their accusations under oath through interrogatories.
