Notes on the False Oswald:

By May 18, 1964, the FBI had conducted an extensive investigation of aspects of the case of the False Oswald. There were interviews with all sorts of people-reporters, Ruder, Greener, grocery-store operators and employees, Lady Jean Campbell of the London Evening Standard was saught out and interviewed, the photographer who had covered part of the story for Paris Match was located in New Orleans (and corroboq rated her) - even the birth of female babies were traced out and listed (re:Whitworth, Hunter. There are 50 typewritten pages of such verbose and redundant reports in Volume 22 at one point (523-58) without a single reference to the most importent single and entirely unshaken clue, that of Sylvis Odio.
