Dear Sir,

In his letter of November 4, received yesterday, your Deputy has refused my requests under 5 U.S.C. 552 for (his language) "all information about said FBI reports concerning Ronnie Gene, questioned for the Warren Commission" and "whose fingerprint was discovered by the FBI on a leaflet which, you assert, Lee Harvey Oswald distributed."

Both of these requests were further and completely and accurately described in earlier correspondence. There is no question of their having been "identifiable records." I have also filed the D-11B form, with check.

The reason given for rejecting these requests is "that the information you are seeking is contained in investigatory files compiled for law enforcement purposes."

I write this letter, in conformity with the law and Departmental regulations, as my appeal from this erroneous rejection of what I am confident is a proper pair of requests, neither of which can be withheld for the reasons given me.
