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Mr. JOHN CORPORAN, WDSU-TV News Room, advised that his station made three films concerning LEE HARVEY OSWALD. He stated that one is a silent film taken on August 16, 1963, at New Orleans when OSWALD was distributing leaflets. Mr. COMPORAN stated the second was a silent film taken on the date of OSWALD's court appearance which was made outside of Municipal Court at New Orleans. The third is a sound film interview which was made August 21, 1963, at the WDSU Studios a few minutes after an audio tape had been made of a debate in which OSWALD participated.

Mr. CORVOMAN stated that single-from prints were made of parts of the silent film when OSVALD was distributing leaflets and these prints have already been firmished to the FBI and to the Secret Service. He stated that a duplicate print of the silent film of OSWALD distributing leaflets has been furnished to the Secret Service. He stated that he was arranging through his film staff to have a copy of all three film clips made today for the FBI. He stated these duplicates would be prepared by Pan American Films, 822 North Rampart Street. New Orleans, Louisiana, and could be picked up between 5 and 5:30 p.m. today.

Mr. CORPORAN furnished an 8" by 10" entargement of a photograph of a school classroom in which OSWALD was facing the camera. Mr. CORPORAN stated that this print was made from a shapshot furnished to him by EDWARD VORBEL, who was as associate of OSWALD during the time OSWALD was attending junior high school at New Orleans. Mr. CORPORAN stated that he did not know the year this photograph was made but stated it was made at Beauregard Junior High School New Orleans, Louisiana, and the class was English 202. Mr. CORPORAN pointed out that this photograph has never been published and that he had forwarded the negative to Life Magazine in New York to determine if they desired to use it and that the negative would be returned to NDSU-TV.

First, this report indicates the existence and federal possession of pictures not in the evidence or files. They are potentially very important, for example, in showing other people in showing Oswald's classmates in school, people who knew him and he might have seen on his return to N.O.
