CD75:397-8, again the investigation is inadequate, in this case angled, and I wonder why there has to be the paraphrase, the line saying Connor "never heard anyone state that OSWALD had any anti-American or pro-Communist views" being enough. But have we seen ant reports of any interviews with Jerry E. Pitts or quotes from the Memphis press? Of course, it was useful that Connor said what is not so, that LHO had an "expert" medal. HILITAIN ACCUST MANCE OF THE HARRY OSHALD

The following investigation was conducted by SAs THOMAS R. MADIGAN and GENE D.E. ROBERTS at Vest Haven, Connecticut, on November 25. 1963:

PETER FRANCIS CONNUR, 27 Plann Drive, West Haven, was interviewed in relation to his knowledge of LEE HARVEY OSWAID. CONWER said he was a newher of Marine Air Control Squadron One, Marine Air Group II. First Marine Air Wing, at the Naval Air Stailon at Atsugi, Japan, during 1957-1958. He said OSWALD was also stationed there and lived in his harricks. CONSCS, whose service number is 1595596, said OSWALD was not a friend of his and he did not have a close knowledge of him. He said ho was a trouble-maker and was engaged in "a few fights". One of these fights, CONKOR said, was with a ROBERT DEKURS, whom CONKOR believes resides in Leviston, Maine.

CONNER reported OSWALD had a privately owned Derringer in the barracks at Atsug!, which discharged at one time: and according to CONNER, OSWALD was grazed with the bullet. CONNER said he thinks OSWALD was later courtmartialed for having the unsutherized pistal.

CONNOR described OSWALD as a "real sloppy Maring...but he had the reputation of being a pretty good worker". He sai he remembered OSWALD wearing an expert rifleman's medal. CORROR said the commander of his cutfit was Lieutenant He said

Colonel N. D. GLENN.

CONNOR stated that there were over 100 Marines quartered in this barracks, where he and OSMALD were located. He did not know of any close personal friends of OSMALD. He said he never heard anyone state that OSWALD had any anti-American or pre-Communist sentirents or that he over made any statements indicating this tendency. He did not

He rdvised OSWALD was still in Japan when he left there, and he has never been contacted since that time by OSWALD or anyone else inquiring about CSWALD until a close friend of his, JERRY E. PITTS, Kemphis. Ternessee, apparently furnished his name to the press in Yemphis. Since then, he has been contacted by the press and the local television station regarding his knowledge and association with OSWALD.
