AT MARINE CORPS AIR STATION (MCAS) EL TORO, CALIFORNIA

Major WILLIAM P. GORSKY, Assistant Provost Marshal, MCAS, El Toro, California, advised SA SAM J. SHOEMAKER on November 22, 1963, that LEE HARVEY DSWALD was assigned to the Lighter Than Air Base, an air facility adjacent to MCAS, El Toro. Major GORSKY stated that OSWALD was discharged from the Marine Base in March, 1959, and that all of OSWALD's records had been forwarded to Washington, D.C. Major GORSKY noted that OSWALD reportedly had been arrested by the Santa Ana, California, Police Department for hitchhiking in 1959, but that a check of the records of the Santa Ana Police Department failed to locate a record for this arrest.
