On 2/9/77, [REDACTED] San Antonio Division,
[REDACTED], Tx. Resident Agency furnished the following:

The FBI has not been involved, and does not intend to be involved, in the actual examination of the \$486,000 in currency, which was recently seized in the possession of two juveniles, by the [REDACTED] Police Department.

U. S. Secret Service, Drug Enforcement Agency, Internal Revenue Service Agents and numerous state and local investigators have examined the money and conducted investigation concerning the money, without determining the origin. IRS has a lien filed against the money, and numerous attorneys are filing claims against the money.

The currency is legitimate and in used condition according to Secret Service. It consists of \$146,000 in \$1 bills and the remainder in \$10, 20 and 50 bills. Because of the volume, only a small portion has been checked in NCIC. It was found wrapped in tin foil in a suitcase, and shows no sign of deterioration.

[REDACTED] explained that his information concerning the money is entirely second-hand info, and he is not aware of referenced Los Angeles letter, however, the money does not appear to have been in the ground very long. He felt definitely that the money could not be associated with captioned matter or LEE HARVEY OSWALD, as speculated in referenced letter. Most of the currency he has heard about is of fairly recent series issue date and he knows of no currency which would go back to 1963 or earlier.

[REDACTED] advised that he would immediately contact [REDACTED] the Dallas Office in the event there were any indications that the currency was associated with captioned matter.
