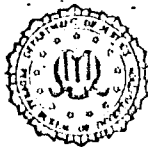

LEE HARVEY OSWALD

On July 30, 1964, Postal Inspector Clarence W. Campbell, United States Post Office Department, 701 Loyola Avenue, New Orleans, Louisiana, advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation of the following information:

Mr. Campbell stated that two issues of "The Militant," which are dated October 14, 1963, and October 21, 1963, were found in Post Office Box 30061, which is located in the Lafayette Square Station and had been formerly rented by Lee Harvey Oswald. Mr. Campbell stated these issues had been found by Postal employee Abraham Plough, a Foreman at this Postal Station and had been turned over by Mr. Plough to Postal Inspector Joseph Zarza and subsequently had been maintained in the Post Office Department's file regarding Lee Harvey Oswald.

Mr. Campbell made available the October 14, 1963, and the October 21, 1963, issues of "The Militant."

Mr. Abraham Plough, Foreman, Lafayette Square Station, United States Post Office, advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on July 31, 1964, that on the evening of November 22, 1963, he was contacted by Postal Inspector Joseph Zarza regarding Post Office Box 30061, which is located at the Lafayette Square Postal Station. Mr. Plough informed that he met Mr. Zarza at the Postal Station and, upon searching the above post office box, he found two issues of "The Militant" in this box, which issues he turned over to Mr. Zarza. Mr. Plough stated that he could not recall the dates of the issues of "The Militant."
