Mr. M. E. REGISTER, Regional Director, Social Security Administration, 9th Floor, 1114 Commerce Street, Dallas, telephonically advised that OSWALD, having been a Veteran, Mrs. OSWALD would be entitled to certain benefits under Social Security. He advised he had no desire to get mixed up with this, but that it was a practice on the part of his agency to notify individuals of the rights they were entitled to under Social Security when his agency became aware of various situations. He stated that he did not desire Mrs. OSWALD to be showing up at their Dallas office, and he was inquiring as to how this situation might be handled.

Mr. REGISTER was advised that the Secret Service was very much interested in all matters relating to the assassination of the President, and that I thought it would be proper for him to contact the Secret Service office here in Dallas concerning this matter.

Subsequently I checked with Inspector TON KELLEY of Secret Service, who is here from Washington Headquarters, at which time he advised me that FORREST V. SORRELS, Agent in Charge, U. S. Secret Service Dallas, had received a call concerning this matter today. I advised Inspector KELLEY that no information was furnished to REGISTER that Secret Service would or would not know the whereabouts of Mrs. OSWALD, but that REGISTER was merely told that Secret Service was believed to be the proper organization to mention this information to.
