Dear Paul,

If I remember correctly, we did not see eye to eye on whether the FBI had conducted a real investigation of LHO before the ass., aside from the deBrueys report. Perhaps my recollection on this is wrong.

In just going over my notes on possible leads from Bishop, # 405, "...immedately (FBI) New Orleans came in, offering a detailed report on Oswald's arrest..." as soon as they started interoffice teletype on this.

Of course, the thorough undependability of Bishop is a factor here, as is his inaccuracy in representing his notes where they do bear a relationship to reality.

But the fact is that deLoach did make the agents available to him, as he says in the book, and it would be wrong to assume Bishop is always wrong.

From the Bonner (ugh) I am led to believe there was a Quigley report other than the one fingering in his testimony. This is my conclusion and may not be so.

I call this to your attention for any interest it may hold.
