Dear Mr. Weisberg:

After having heard your evidence concerning the Kennedy assassination, I believe that you may well have proof that it was the result of conspiracy. If the photograph shown on a recent JOE PYNE show is indeed one of Lee Harvey Oswald standing in the doorway of that building, as it appears to be, there can be no alternative but to conclude that Oswald did not fire the fatal shot, or any shot. But to me, equally as startling as the photograph itself is the fact that the Warren Commission never saw it; they only viewed a copy.

There has been a good deal of discussion on the GENE BURNS radio program (WCBM) recently concerning the Warren Report and its inadequacies. Mr. Burns keeps an open mind on the subject, but states that until another theory is advanced that is equally acceptable as the Warren Report, he shall continue to accept Oswald's guilt.
