Dear Mr. Weisberg,

Thank you for your letter of Feb 6<sup>th</sup>. I have wrote to many people concerning the assassination but you are the only one whom has answered my questions. I have followed the Shaw Trial very closely in the newspapers and two things strike me as funny; (1) Only the A.P. has carried the stories, and (2) they try to brand Mr. Garrison's witnesses as "nuts."

I also wondered why Mr. Garrison has not called Dean Adams Andrews? In your book - "Oswald in New Orleans" - Chapter 5 you quote his testimony to Commission Council Siebel as saying that "Clay Bertrand" called up Mr. Andrews while he was in the Hospital and asking him if he would be Oswald's lawyer. On page 122 Andrews describes Bertrand as "He is about 5 feet 8 inches. ~~Hot~~ Got sandy hair, blue eyes, ruddy complexion. Must weigh about 165, 170, 175." Which seems to jibe with Shaw's description.
