# Edwards: 'Blew My Cool' In Approval of Bribery

BATON ROUGE, La. (AP)—Louisiana Gov. Edwin Edwards said Thursday he made "a horrible mistake" when he told reporters last week that he saw nothing wrong with American businessmen bribing foreign officials to do business overseas.

"I just blew my cool," Edwards said. "I know I'm not a politician, but I wish I could go back on that."

Edwards said he was caught in an informal news conference the day after he admitted his wife had accepted a bribe from South American businessman Abraham Baruch.

He said he was angry and frustrated because of the gift and when asked about the gift, he acted like a pouty little boy.

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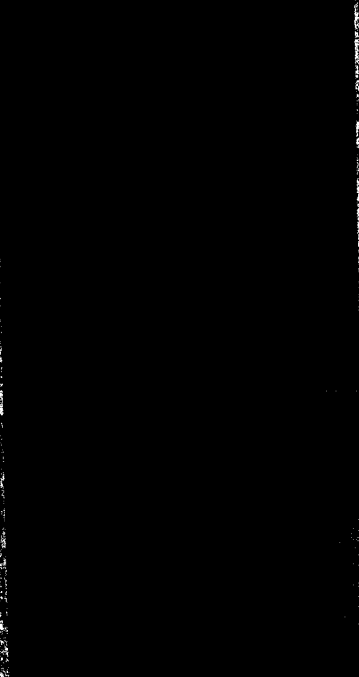
Edwards said the girl was just something that wanted to do for a good cause and had nothing to do with bribery.

Edwards told reporters at his news conference last week that he was "all for" making payments to do business overseas. Asked if that included bribery, he said: "Absolutely, pay bribes."

He said American businessmen need opportunities for overseas sales because somebody came up with the idea of a "laissez-faire" attitude that you shouldn't be making payments to people in foreign countries. That's a moral thing that shouldn't be looked at by the United States of America. And in order to compete, it's necessary to do that in those countries.

Edwards said he was not in favor of bribery. I wish nations without bribery laws would adopt them.

He said it is what he really meant to say.
