

## JUDGE SLATES PARTIN RETRIAL

To Begin Nov. 1 for B.R.  
Teamster Boss

BUTTE, Mont. (AP) — Baton Rouge Teamster boss Edward Grady Partin will get a new trial this Nov. 1, U.S. Dist. Court Judge W. D. Murray announced Monday.

An earlier trial for Partin ended in a mistrial July 8 after the jury failed to reach a verdict.

Partin has been charged with five counts of federal anti-trust violations in connection with an alleged conspiracy to aid Ted

F. Dunham Jr. monopolize the concrete industry in the Baton Rouge area.

Dunham has already been convicted on two counts of criminal conspiracy and awaits sentencing.

Partin's trial was moved to Butte on a change of venue motion. Forty prosecution and 27 defense witnesses testified during the four-week trial and the jury deliberated for 10 hours before declaring itself unable to reach a verdict.

Partin was instrumental in the conviction of former International Teamster President James Hoffa on jury tampering charges.

Partin is currently free on \$25,000 bond.
