Dear Oliver,

A Washington hifi shop ran some specials this weekend. One is an Akai at \$239 plus tax. Same number but without the Mark II at the end, so I suppose it is a superceded model. However, it also has Dolby and in the cut looks to be identical. My lawyer/friend Jim Cesar was going to try to pick one up for me this weekend. I'll see him Thursday, when we are in court if he does not come up with his wife and kid tomorrow to take in the gorgeous fall colors to the leaves that soon will be dropping.

I'll let you know if I get it and of course I'll be getting interested in tapes.
