Dear Carol,

Do I remember correctly that you said you had a nice note from Mrs. King?

I wrote Dexter some time ago and got no reply. Not even the politeness of acknowledging receipt.

There are separate questions involved and it can be that some can be answered and some cannot be. What Oliver Stone comes up with will answer nothing. It will be sensational and it may well contain much that is true but he'll not take the time or do the work to really know the material and some of what Pepper said has him being sued, I'm told.

I can understand the King interest in solving the case but what they can't understand is that without any real official investigation of the case to begin with there is little prospect of a real solution.

Separate from that is whether the government told the truth. This is the question, was Jimmy guilty? That is, as you know, where I did my work. I think that the result of what I did proves that Jimmy was not guilty and that the government knew it.

What I have in mind is that if you have heard from Mrs. King you might write and suggest that she might have someone whose judgement she trusts look at what I have. I ask nothing in return and with no probability of publication of the book manuscript I've about finished, there will be no involvement in that.

A friend who is a former history professor who has just retired volunteered to retype this manuscript. She can get his opinion of the part he has done, which is less than half of it, if she'd like. By the time you can get this he'll have all but the conclusions, which I'm working on now, and the foreword and introduction, which I'll get to. It may not be easy for Mrs. King to understand but opposing the government on assassinations is the way not to be published. So, as I think I told you, this will be but a record for our history. At least for now if not permanently.
