Oswald's Arsenal

Photo of 2 Murder Weapons?

Lee Harvey Oswald posed in his Dallas backyard last April, bearing his arsenal and a rolled-up copy of a newspaper called "The Militant."

The photo, published by the Dallas Morning News, shows him holding the rifle that is believed to have been used to assassinate President Kennedy. And the revolver at his hip is believed to have been the one with which Dallas Patrolman J. D. Tippit was slain as police pursued Oswald after the President's assassination here last November 22.

Meanwhile, Dallas police issued a ballistics report yesterday which indicated that the rifle used to kill Mr. Kennedy may have been the same used in the unsuccessful attack on former General Edwin Walker last April at his home in a Dallas suburb.

Police said the slug that missed Walker matched fragments of the bullets that took the President's life.

Oswald's wife has testified that, the night the shot was fired at Walker, her husband came home and blurted out that he had "killed" the former general.
