Dear Larry,

When I could not get through to Jim McKinley, Tom's suggestion, I had planned to call him after supper his time.

Then Jim Lesar, my lawyer in an FOIA case, phoned me from the Los Angeles airport to tell me we will not be able to work on the affidavit I have to file when I am finished in New York. And that I must complete going over the draft and mail it to him tomorrow.
