A review of FD-302's reflects that JESSE R. CORE, III was interviewed by SA JAMES ROYCE ~~PKK~~, 11/29/63, concerning handbills handed out in front of the International Trade Mart, 8/16/63. CORE stated he observed ~~this~~ activity for some 20 to 25 minutes and saw ~~two~~ people handing out handbills.

CORE should be recontacted with photos of this activity to determine if the two persons observed by him were OSWALD and CHARLES HALL STEELE and whether or not he observed a third person handing out handbills. It is noted that STEELE and OSWALD are the only ~~ones~~ who can be definitely determined from photos as handing out the handbills but STEELE has stated when he met OSWALD in front of the International Trade Mart Building he was accompanied by another individual described as having olive complexion, dark hair and approximately 6 feet tall, who apparently was handing out some handbills.

RE: ASSOCIATES OF LEE HARVEY OSWALD

On 11/27/63, CARLOS BRINGUIER stated that ORESTES PENA, operator of the Habana Bar, 117 Decatur St., New Orleans, La. stated OSWALD was in this bar sometime between 8/15 and 8/30/63 with a Mexican individual and that this Mexican was later in the bar with another Mexican. BRINGUIER also stated from talking with PENA he understood OSWALD may have frequented a restaurant at Iberville and Decatur Streets.

It is noted that in interview with DEAN ANDREWS, attorney, he has stated OSWALD was accompanied to his office on two occasions by a "Mexican looking kid who gave the appearance of being a homosexual".

ANDREWS had no contact with this individual but merely observed him accompany OSWALD to his office.

Interview PENA for all information concerning the Mexican allegedly accompanying OSWALD at the Habana Bar and for any information that OSWALD may have frequented a restaurant at Iberville and Decatur Streets.
