PHOTOGRAPHIC WHITEWASH

"Dallas, Texas
March 18, 1964

"I, Mrs. R. E. (Carolyn) Arnold, hereby freely and voluntarily make the following statement to E. J. Robertson who has identified himself as a Special Agent of the F.B.I.

"My name is Carolyn Arnold and I am married to R. E. Arnold. I reside at 3325 South Tyler Street, Dallas, Texas. I am 20 years of age, born June 1, 1943, at Memphis, Tenn. I am a white female, and am employed by the Texas School Book Depository as a Secretary.

"On November 22, 1963, at the time President Kennedy was shot, I was standing in front of the Texas School Book Depository Building. I was with Mr. O. V. Campbell, 7120 Twin Tree Lane, Dallas, Mrs. L. C. (Bonnie) Richey, 220 South Marsalis, Apt. 117, Dallas, Mrs. Barney (Betty) Drago, 2705 West Brooklyn, Dallas; Mrs. Pat (Viviane) Baker nee Ruckley, 3600 1/2 Live Oak, Dallas; and Miss Jody Johnson, 915 Sunnyvale, Dallas, at the time President Kennedy was shot.

"I did not see Lee Harvey Oswald at the time President Kennedy was shot.

"On the morning of November 22, 1963, I do not remember seeing any stranger in the building housing the Texas School Book Depository.

"I left the Texas School Book Depository Building at about 12:25 PM, November 22, 1963, and never returned to this building on that date.

"I have read the above statement consisting of one and one-half pages and it is true and correct to the best of my knowledge.

Mrs. Arnold saw Oswald on the first floor of the building right before the assassination. He could not have been on the first and sixth floors at the same time, hence could not have been an assassin. Instead of calling her before the Commission to swear to what she had seen, the FBI went back and asked her not if she had seen Oswald before the assassination but during it, when she was outside and he was inside. The short report is suppressed, the second printed. Suppression and deception, manipulation of evidence. Note also that in her signed statement she gave a later time that the FBI attributed to her, making it even more impossible for Oswald to have been the killer. See pp. 210-1.

Mrs. R. E. ARNOLD, Secretary, Texas School Book Depository, advised she was in her office on the second floor of the building on November 22, 1963, and left that office between 12:00 and 12:15 PM, to go downstairs and stand in front of the building to view the Presidential Motorcade. As she was standing in front of the building, she stated she thought she caught a fleeting glimpse of LEE HARVEY OSWALD standing in the hallway between the front door and the double doors leading to the warehouse, located on the first floor. She could not be sure that this was OSWALD, but said she felt it was and believed the time to be a few minutes before 12:15 PM.

She stated thereafter she viewed the Presidential Motorcade and heard the shots that were fired at the President; however, she could furnish no information of value as to the individual firing the shots or any other information concerning OSWALD, whom she stated she did not know and had merely seen him working in the building.

Mrs. Dorman watched the assassination from the 4th floor of the building, took pictures of it, said the shots did not come from two floor overhead, as the government asserts, but from behind the President. So, she was not called as a witness. Her pictures are not in evidence, not in the files. This report was not published. It was secret, suppressed! See p. 177.

Mrs. JOAN T. (EISIE) DORMAN, 1233 East Louisiana, Dallas, Texas, advised that she is employed in a clerical capacity for the Scott-Foresman Company, Educational Publishers, offices located on the fourth floor of the Texas School Book Depository Building.

She stated she had never seen LEE HARVEY OSWALD in the building and failed to recognize his photographs when shown on television.

When the president's motorcade passed, Mrs. DORMAN advised she was looking out the window on the fourth floor. The window was raised and she was taking pictures. It was at this time she heard sounds which sounded like shots. She felt that those shots were coming from the area of the Records Building. She stated she had seen no one whom she could associate with the shots during or after the shots were fired and was unable to provide any additional information.

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Critic of Warren Commission Disputes Film Timing of Assassination Shots

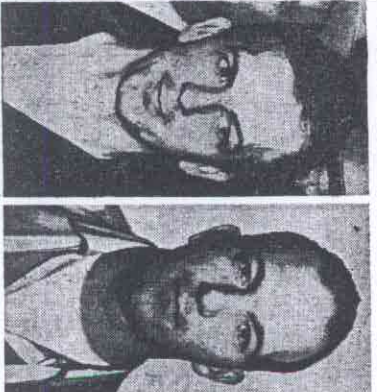

A critic of the Warren Commission contended yesterday that a key timing for the assassination of President Kennedy should have been released at 3.5 seconds instead of 2. The contention evoked new, although mainly private, revelations.

The critic, Harold Weisberg, argued that this shortened time would imply a second assassin to account for three shots in 1.8 seconds. He said he had seen a film of Oswald's rifle fired in the time in which the commission held President Kennedy and Gov. John B. Connally Jr. were being shot. The film was obtained by Lee Harvey Oswald as a home assassin.

Oswald's rifle required 2.3 seconds between shots — three seconds between the first and second shots. The commission had had three seconds between the first and second shots. Weisberg said he had seen a film of Oswald's rifle fired in the time in which the commission held President Kennedy and Gov. John B. Connally Jr. were being shot. The film was obtained by Lee Harvey Oswald as a home assassin.

Weisberg's new book, that had been published from a commission on that issue, was reviewed by an FBI man, who believed he had never seen it.
