Dear Arthur,

Although you have not responded to my last letter/request, my situation has not improved (and it would be irrational to expect it to) and I continue to have needs I can't satisfy.

We are almost out of the MCR paper you have so thoughtfully provided. I would estimate that our middle sheets, I think they are known as 17-pound sheets, will last for several months, but we are almost out of the final sheets, those treated on one side only and called 15-pound sheets. If you could supply us with one package of the latter, it would balance us out. I'd appreciate it very much. I enclose the label from our last package of the 15s.

If you can see your way clear to doing this, please do not bother with using Greyhound, which is more costly and troubling to your girls. Parcel Post will get it here fast enough. The tax season is the one time of the year we have even a small regular income. My wife will begin working on Monday and will be able to do my work nights and weekends only.

From your silence, I have come to believe that you have lost your interest in this subject or are not well. I hope neither is the case. I am much wearier but I continue, in terms of what I produce, with considerable success. I have completed what I believe is far and away the most definitive book yet. I'd also be kidding myself if I thought it had any commercial prospects. And I've done about all the research and have started several others.

It looks as though I'll have to be in New York the 15th. If I am, I'll be busy all that day. However, if you'd like to get together, I can come up the day before, a Friday. If I do, I'd make it as close to lunchtime as possible and could go to your office from the station. I'll go by train.
