When we spoke in December I was impressed by the fact that busy as you must be you nonetheless had more knowledge of and interest in the JFK assassination than most people.


Also with the fact that you were the one who tipped the Chronicle off on Posner's use of Failure Analysis work as his own and the purpose for which Failure Analysis did that work.
