So if I'm downtown I can walk wherever I have to go and if I'm out nights I'll use cabs. The honorarium will pay for it but I don't want to shoot it all on a hotel. There are other things that can annoy friend, from the possibility of much time on the phone to the washing and hanging to dry of the supports I wear and the talcum needed to put them on.
