**Capitol Bomb  
Probe Again  
Under Way**

A federal grand jury in Detroit resumed investigation of the March 1 bombing of the Capitol yesterday, calling war activist Jane Silverman to testify.

In San Francisco, a jury probe of the assassination of Sen. James Earl Ray, a member of the Republican National Convention, is also under way.

At the same time, a grand jury in Detroit is probing the activities of said Abbie Hoffman, leader of the Youth International Party (YIP), in connection with the protest.

Miss Silverman, 30, a veteran worker in the peace movement, indicated she would testify if she were subpoenaed. She said she has no contact with the YIP, but she is an underground movement member.

The grand jury is also probing the activities of a group of individuals who are active in the underground movement.

It is now believed that Silverman was involved in the current phase of the underground movement.

She could not be reached in Detroit for comment on her subpoena to the grand jury.

A grand jury in Detroit subpoenaed activists who were active with the 20-day demonstrations here and calling themselves the "Psychedelic Scapegoat." They also have refused to testify.

Five filed a suit in June to block their appearance, claiming among other things that information leading to their subpoenas stemmed from illegal government wiretaps. Hearings on the suit have not been completed.

Three of the activists are Kelly, of Detroit; Tom Tauber, of Detroit; and Michael, of Chapel Hill, N.C. They issued new subpoenas in San Francisco yesterday, currently pending.

At the same conference in which Hoffman announced the San Diego protest, the three vowed not to cooperate with the Detroit grand jury and burned what they said were their subpoenas.
