Landlady Of Oswald

DALLAS, Jan. 9 (UPI)—Earline Roberts, landlady of Lee Harvey Oswald, assassin of President Kennedy, died today, little more than two years after her small rooming house became a landmark. She was 60.

Mrs. Roberts is the second person connected with the assassination to die in recent weeks. The taximan, William W. Whaley, who drove Oswald from downtown Dallas to a spot in Oak Cliff near his rooming house just after the slaying was killed in a traffic accident Dec. 18.

Oswald rented a small room from Mrs. Roberts at 1026 Beckley ave. under an assumed name a few weeks before the tragedy on Nov. 22, 1963. It was there Oswald went to change jackets and pick up a revolver with which he killed policeman J. D. Tippitt.

Mrs. Roberts's small house was flooded by sightseers, tourists and the curious. Photographers paid handsome fees to take pictures. She sold the house a year ago and was running another rooming house.

She died following a heart attack. At Parkland Hospital, where President Kennedy was pronounced dead and where Oswald died.
