### INFORMATION ON OVERNIGHT ACCOMMCDATIONS

CHAUTAUQUA HALL

Fredonia State College has made available a comfortable college dormitory with rooms containing two single beds. Family and other guests are welcome, but only two people may occupy any room. ## DRIVING INSTRUCTIONS TO CONFERENCE SITE

from NYS Thruway and points east and west:

take exit 59 Dunkirk-Fredonia.

2. drive straight ahead past Rt 60, Tops Market on right and to dead end of this road.

3. turn left on Central Avenue.

4. after 1/4 mile, turn right at college entrance.

5. at first road coming into access road (before brick building), turn left and follow this road which makes a sharp right around a brick building; after sharp right, turn left into parking lot, go to far end of this lot; Chautauqua Hall is the last building, next to a tennis court. Go in lobby of this building for more info. from Route 60, Pennsylvania and points south:

1. continue on Rt. 60 past intersection with Rt 20, past Movieplex on right and turn left at first traffic light.

2. follow # 2 through 5, above.

from Buffalo and Canadian points via Route 5:

1. continue on Rt. 5 to middle of Dunkirk; at the pier and Demetri's Restaurant, turn left onto Central Avenue; follow this street 3 miles, past thruway underpass to college entrance.

2. follow #4,5 above

OTHER NOTES

- 1. Informal attire is suggested for participants. Temperatures can range from rather cool to very warm.
- 2. There are many summer recreational attractions in the area, including Chautauqua Institution, located 20 miles away and opening the weekend of the conference. If you have time and inclination to enjoy any of these attractions, we can send you some tourist-type information.

3. For those arriving by air: we cannot, unfortunately, provide chauffeur service for the 45 or so mile trip to Buffalo Airport. A car rental may be your only practicable way

to get from "here to there."

4. There is pretty good bus service for those coming from east of Fredonia but terrible

service for those coming from the west.
