

Control of El Tiempo Is Won by New Group

A new management team has been named at El Tiempo, the Spanish-Language newspaper, as the result of what was described yesterday as "a hard-fought proxy battle in which a group of investors has won control of the publication."

An immediate consequence of the change was the elimination of Stanley Rose, who had been editor in chief and associate publisher since the paper's founding in 1963.

Juan Angel Bras, a former editor, is rejoining the newspaper as editor. He had been program director, news director and a founder of WNJU-TV (Channel 47), the Spanish-language television station.

Philip A. Uzielli, director of Operational Services International, Merck & Co., Inc., remains as president and publisher posts he has held since last June.

El Tiempo, which has a daily circulation of 41,000 and 46,000 on Sunday, is traditionally Republican in its editorial policy, a spokesman said, and will continue its support to Mayor Lindsay.
