

Ruby Jailer Resigns Game Warden Post

HOUSTON, April 5 (AP)—
Norman Hooten, the former
Dallas deputy sheriff who says
Jack Ruby made many disclo-
sures to him, has resigned his
post as a game warden.

He said he resigned under
fire from his superior. But J.R.
Singleton, executive director of
the Parks and Wildlife Depart-
ment, said he did not know
why Hooten quit.

Hooten was a guard in the
Dallas county jail while Ruby
was confined there. Ruby killed
Lee Harvey Oswald, named by
the Warren Commission as the
assassin of President John F.
Kennedy.

Hooten says he is writing a
book about what Ruby told
him in jail. He also said Ruby
wrote a will in jail that left
Hooten several small items.

Hooten said Singleton told
him he had "no business being
involved in writing any books
about a Jack Ruby or knowing
anything about the assassina-
tion."
