night. Before I could do anything, Bud's body was cremated and an autopsy had not been performed. I was shaken and immediately called Russo, who was equally shaken. I then called, Doug Sandhage and gave him the news. The result was the third article, entitled "The Kennedy Cover Up," published on April 25, 1991, detailing the Fensterwald story.

Shortly after this incident, Oliver Stone, the Hollywood producer, was in the process of making a movie called *JFK*. The announcement brought a huge amount of publicity. Again, I received a call from Sandhage who asked me if I would mind if they did another story on me, and incidentally in the process if I would mind taking a polygraph test. I had already said I would at the time the first article was published and it was arranged for in January. Also as part of the article, Doug went to the trouble of verifying some of my data himself. The article speaks for itself.¹³

In some ways this book is a result of my chagrin over what has been perpetrated on the American public for over four decades. There is no question that we need a CIA, and that it will still continue doing what it has always done — whether right or wrong. However, one has to say sometimes . . . wait a minute . . .
